#### General Rules and Regulations

1. The Stutsman County Fair management reserves to its Board the final and absolute right to interpret these Rules and Regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard hereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the Fair.

2. Exhibitors need not be residents of Stutsman County.

3. Removal of exhibits will not be allowed before the close of the fair except on written permission from the officials in charge.

4. The Board reserves the right to reject any entries offered, particularly such as require an unreasonable amount of space or are difficult to display.

5. The Fair management will take every precaution within its power for the preservation and protection of stock and articles on exhibition after their arrival and arrangement on the grounds, but will not be responsible for any loss, theft, or damage by fire or otherwise that may occur. Exhibitors are required to give attention to their exhibits, and at the close of the Fair to attend promptly to their removal.

6. Each concessionaire shall cause to be posted in a conspicuous manner, at the front of the entrance to the place of business, a sign showing the price to be charged for meals, lunches, soft drinks, as well as concession number.

7. The Board reserves the right to formulate and announce new rules to meet emergencies to adjudicate all matters arising from the Fair after it is held.

8. The Board reserves the right to direct and regulate the parking of all automobiles or other vehicles or conveyances within the fair grounds and to direct where they shall be driven therein. It may prohibit the running of automobiles in any section of the grounds, wherever in its opinion common safety demands it.

9. The Fair management reserves the right to exclude from the fair grounds any person or persons whom it shall deem undesirable, or who shall violate any of the rules laid down by the management or who shall otherwise become offensive.

10. No person shall act as judge in any lot or capacity, in which he or she is an exhibitor.

1. All articles exhibited in this department will be accepted by the Superintendents at the Russ Melland exhibit building.

2. **ARTICLES MUST BE MADE BY ENTRANT IN 2021 OR 2022 AND NOT EXHIBITED PREVIOUSLY AT THE STUTSMAN COUNTY FAIR HOME & HOBBY DEPARTMENT.**

3. Exhibitors are required to provide a list of entries with class and exhibit number. Entry items must be listed in order. The form on the back page is provided for this purpose.

4. A person may enter only one article in any one exhibit number.

**5. SOILED OR UNFINISHED ARTICLES NOT ACCEPTED OR DISPLAYED.**

6. Judges are home economists or specialists hired by the Fair Board. The decision of the judge is final. The judges reserve the right to withhold an award at their discretion.

7. The association is not responsible for breakage, damage or loss. All possible care is exercised. Entries are accepted only upon these conditions.

**8. Exhibits removed from cabinet by the superintendents only. Prize money is paid at take out time.**

**9. EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PICKING UP THEIR EXHIBITS AT TAKE OUT TIME. IF UNABLE TO DO SO THEY MUST MAKE ARRANGEMENTS FOR SOMEONE ELSE TO PICK THEM UP. THE SUPERINTENDENTS ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY UNCLAIMED EXHIBITS OR PRIZE MONEY.**

**Grain, Grasses, Alfalfa & Clover** -- All exhibits of sheaf grain must be tied in three places and be 2.5 to 4 inches in diameter. No roots to be left on the bottom of the sheaf. Leaves to be left on green sheaves.

**Grain** — All exhibits of harvested grain requires: 2 quarts of small grains and other large seeds; 1 quart of flax, grasses and other small seeds. May use zip lock bag or bag obtained at elevator. Harvested grain must be cleaned.
